In addition, extended office hours during the 2020 primary election season will be as follows:

Thursday, April 16 – 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday, May 29 - 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday, June 1 – 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Friday, May 22 – 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, May 30 – 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, June 2 - 6 a.m. to 11 p.m.* or later, depending on election activities

Pre-registration deadline for voter registration closes at 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 22, 2020. Persons wishing to participate in this election who register to vote after May 22, 2020 will be required to provide proof of identification (i.e. current and valid photo identification card with an expiration date), AND proof of residency in their voting precinct, when they go to the polls on election day, or when they request an absentee ballot. Other provisions may also apply. Persons not registered to vote by May 22, 2020 should expect a longer processing time at the polls on election day. See the next page for additional information regarding identification requirements for voters going to the polls on Tuesday, June 2, 2020.

Absentee Ballots will be available beginning Thursday, April 23, 2020 BY MAIL, and beginning Monday, May 4, 2020 for in-person voting.

- The last day an absentee ballot may be mailed to a voter for this election is Friday, May 22, 2020. (Postal delivery is now two to five days each way.)
- In-person absentee voting in the office of the Jones County Auditor closes at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020.
- Requests for absentee ballots must be in writing and should be mailed or delivered to:

 Absentee ballot request forms are available at the following locations:

 - In lieu of the form, voters may submit their request on a piece of paper no smaller than 3" x 5" containing the following information: Voter's name, birth date, ID number (i.e. drivers' license number, non-operator ID number, or voter PIN number), address in Jones County (and mailing address-if different), political party ballot being requested for this primary election (Republican or Democratic), brief statement requesting an absentee ballot for the 2020 Primary Election, and the voter's signature. A telephone number is recommended, but not required. Missing information will delay the issuance of the ballot.
 - Ballots may not be mailed to persons who are not registered to vote by May 22, 2020.

Voted absentee ballots returned by mail MUST be postmarked not later than Monday, June 1, 2020, and then received in the Auditor's Office not later than 12:00 noon on Monday, June 8, 2020 to be considered for counting. Voters are advised to keep in mind that postal delivery is now two to five days.

IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR VOTERS GOING TO THE POLLS ON TUESDAY, JUNE 2, 2020

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) may 1) have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's office by 12:00 noon on Monday, June 8, 2020. Election Day Registrant attesters must provide an approved form of identification. NOTICE TO VOTERS - LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

As a result of the legislative redistricting process following the 2010 census, Jones County was divided into two legislative districts.

- The cities of Anamosa and Monticello; and Cass, Castle Grove, Jackson, Lovell, and Wayne Townships, along with a very small portion of Fairview Township lying north and east of the City of Anamosa, and north of Highway 64 are in State Senate District 48, and State House District 96.
- The cities of Cascade, Martelle, Morley, Olin, Onslow, Oxford Junction, and Wyoming; and Clay, Greenfield, Hale, Madison, Oxford, Richland, Rome, Scotch Grove, Washington, and Wyoming Townships, along with the remainder of Fairview Township, are in State Senate District 29, and State House District 58.
